<p>We are delighted that such a vast majority of those who responded were generally happy with both schools - particularly with the crucial issues of children's safety, well-being and behaviour. Although parents don't observe lessons, it seems that the feedback you get from your children, as well as the way and frequency with which progress is reported, gives you confidence in the quality of teaching and learning at both schools.</p>	<p>There were two questions that fewer than 80% of questionnaires responded positively to.</p> <p>The first was bullying but this appears to be because a lot of parents hadn't experienced incidents of bullying and so didn't know how to respond - (36% don't know at Tacolneston and 50% at Morley). Only 2% of the questionnaires seemed to see bullying as an issue.</p> <p>The second was homework with 15% of Tacolneston parents' questionnaires disagreeing with the homework currently set. Homework policy is something that governors regularly consider with the Head Teacher and in consultation with staff. We will therefore take into account these responses from parents as one of the factors to consider during our next review.</p>
